

How to take part in our Hedgehog survey

We only need one form if you have seen a hedgehog or evidence of their presence: it is not an ongoing survey, just a snapshot!

Please download the survey form and let us have the information as detailed below:

Who?

The person who is making the observation (usually you) including your name and preferably your contact details, so that we can contact you in the future for any further information on the sighting.

The records will be passed to the Kent and Medway Biological Records Centre but they will not pass the contact details onto any third party.

What?

Simply what you saw! But with as much detail as possible please. Did you see a hedgehog or their droppings? How many? Did they look like adults or young ones?

(Hedgehog droppings are cylindrical, up to 5cm long, generally dark, and with no obvious structure when eating worms but usually studded with shiny fragments of insects.)

Where?

Where you made the observation. Again, as much detail as possible. If it was in your garden, please give your address (if you don't want to give your full address, please give the road name). If it was in the Park, try to give details so we can tell roughly whereabouts (like 'lower football pitch' or 'by the Oast House').

When?

When you made the observation. This could be just 'May 2013', but again, the greater the detail, the better i.e. day/month/year.
