

News from the Committee

As you may recall from my update in March, the FoGH committee faced some unexpected challenges earlier this year. However, I can now report that we've emerged from this period and I'd like to share some changes.

After many years of dedicated service, commitment and voluntary hours in the Park, Jane Melville is standing down as Membership Secretary. Jane was a founding member of this group and has worked tirelessly to support the Park, the Friends group and the many events we hold. We would like to formally thank Jane for her dedication and hard work over the past 13 years.

Her position on the committee is going to be taken over by Clare Kelly, who masterfully organised the successful April Dog Show and many other popular FoGH events. Clare's organisational skills and dedication are a fantastic asset to the FoGH team, and we look forward to her contributions in this important role.

Our events so far this year have all been successful, including the start of our Green Team projects, with volunteers kitted out in our new RTW In Bloom t-shirts. Join us on Saturday 8th June for our next project, replanting the baskets around the hub railings. All these baskets were purchased by FoGH and are looked after by volunteers.

In April we were pleased to see the water bottle filling station moved to the grassy area by Auckland Road gates, which we always felt was its ideal location. We were also glad when the wetland bridge repairs were finished, and we continue to liaise with Tunbridge Wells Borough Council about park maintenance. We understand several diseased trees have had to be cut down, or trimmed back, this spring.

Hopefully in the summer some of the logs will be moved into the community orchard to replace the seating installed in 2015. The orchard looked beautiful when the blossom was out, and we have spotted yellow rattle flowers, which we planted last autumn with Kent High Weald Partnership, the first stage in our wildflower meadow project.
